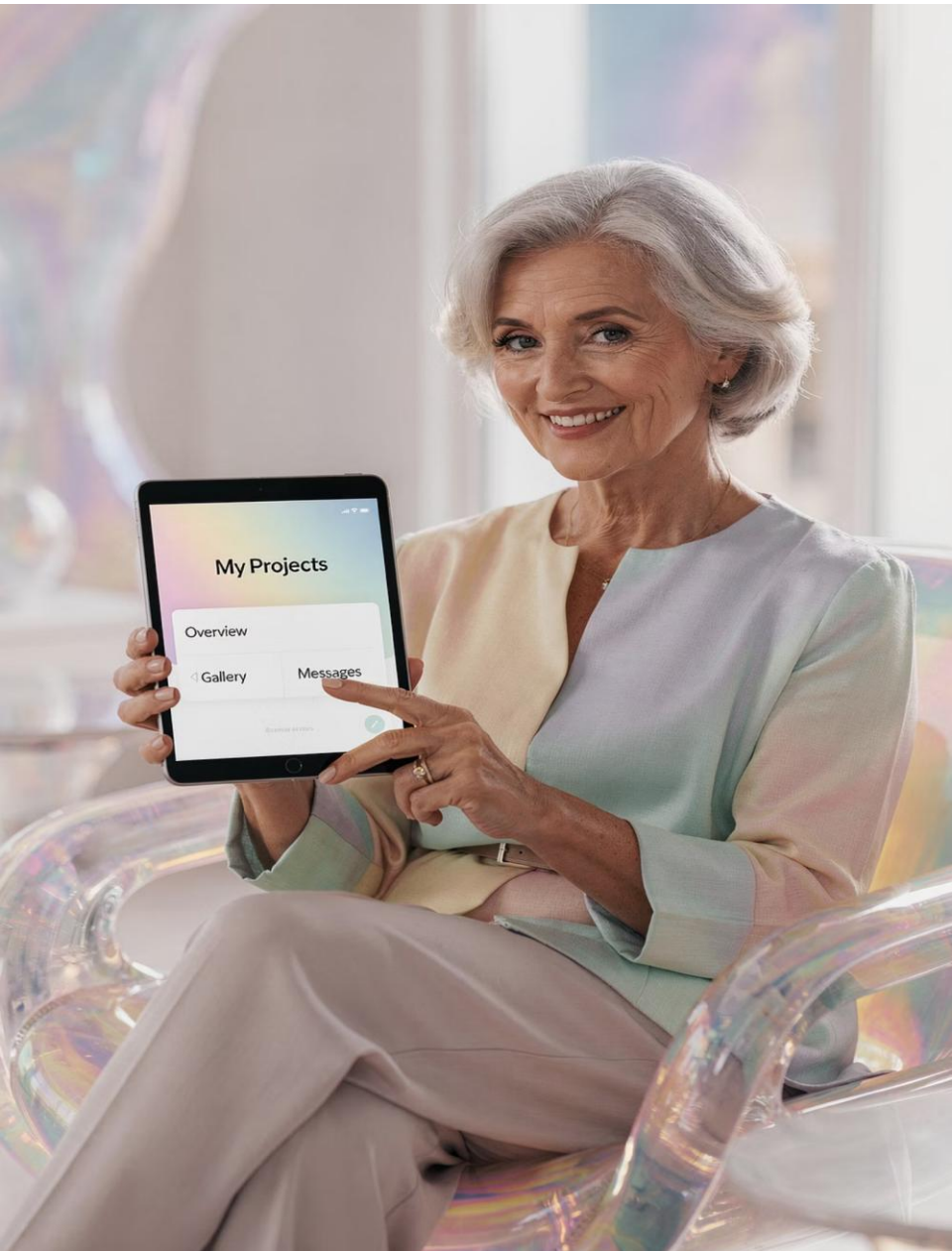
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Today's Goal

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Apps = Tools

Think of It This Way

Apps are tools – just like a drawer full of tools at home, each one has a purpose. You don't need to master every app on the iPad any more than you need to know how to use a chainsaw to butter toast.

You just need the tools that help you do the jobs *you* care about.



Each Has a Job

Every app is built for a specific purpose.



Use What You Need

Focus only on the apps that are useful to you.



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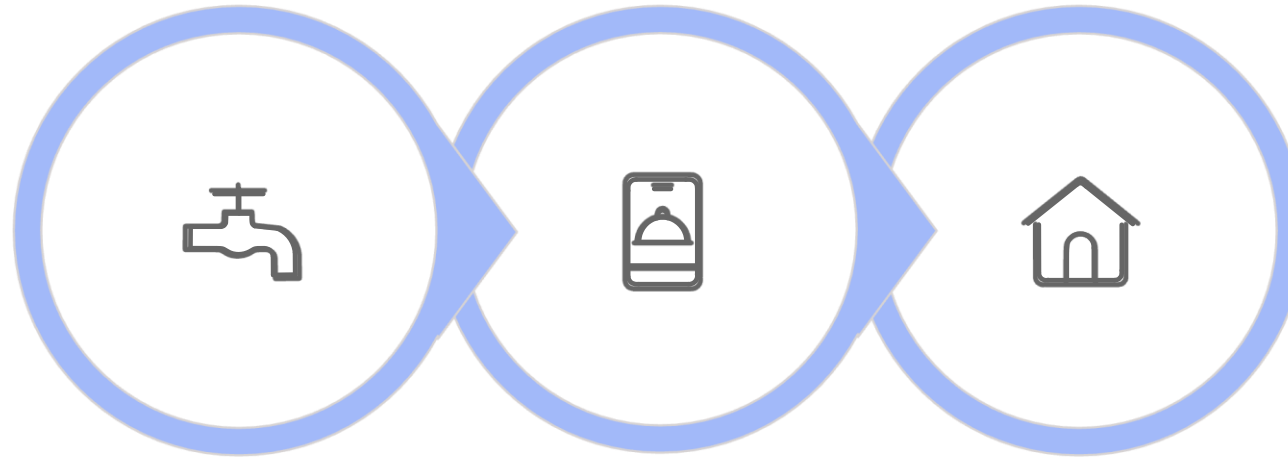


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Opening & Closing Apps



Tap to Open

Use It

Return Home

Most apps follow this same simple rhythm. Once you get that basic pattern down, the iPad starts feeling a lot less mysterious. A lot of confidence comes from realizing that most things work the same general way.

Safari – Your Window to the Web

Browse

Visit any website – news, recipes, local businesses, and more.

Search

Look up anything you're curious about, quickly and easily.

Explore

Settle arguments, find directions, read the news – Safari is the front door to the online world, minus the squeaky hinges.



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Searching the Web

Plain English Works Just Fine

You don't need fancy computer language. Type naturally — the iPad doesn't expect elegance. It just wants a clue.

"weather tomorrow"

"best chicken soup recipe"

"nearest CVS"

Three Easy Steps

1. Type your question in the search bar
2. Tap the Search button
3. Pick a result that looks helpful



Mail – Stay Connected

Email is still one of the handiest tools on the iPad. It lets you read messages, reply when needed, and keep up with family, friends, doctors, businesses, and organizations.



Read

Open and read messages at your own pace.



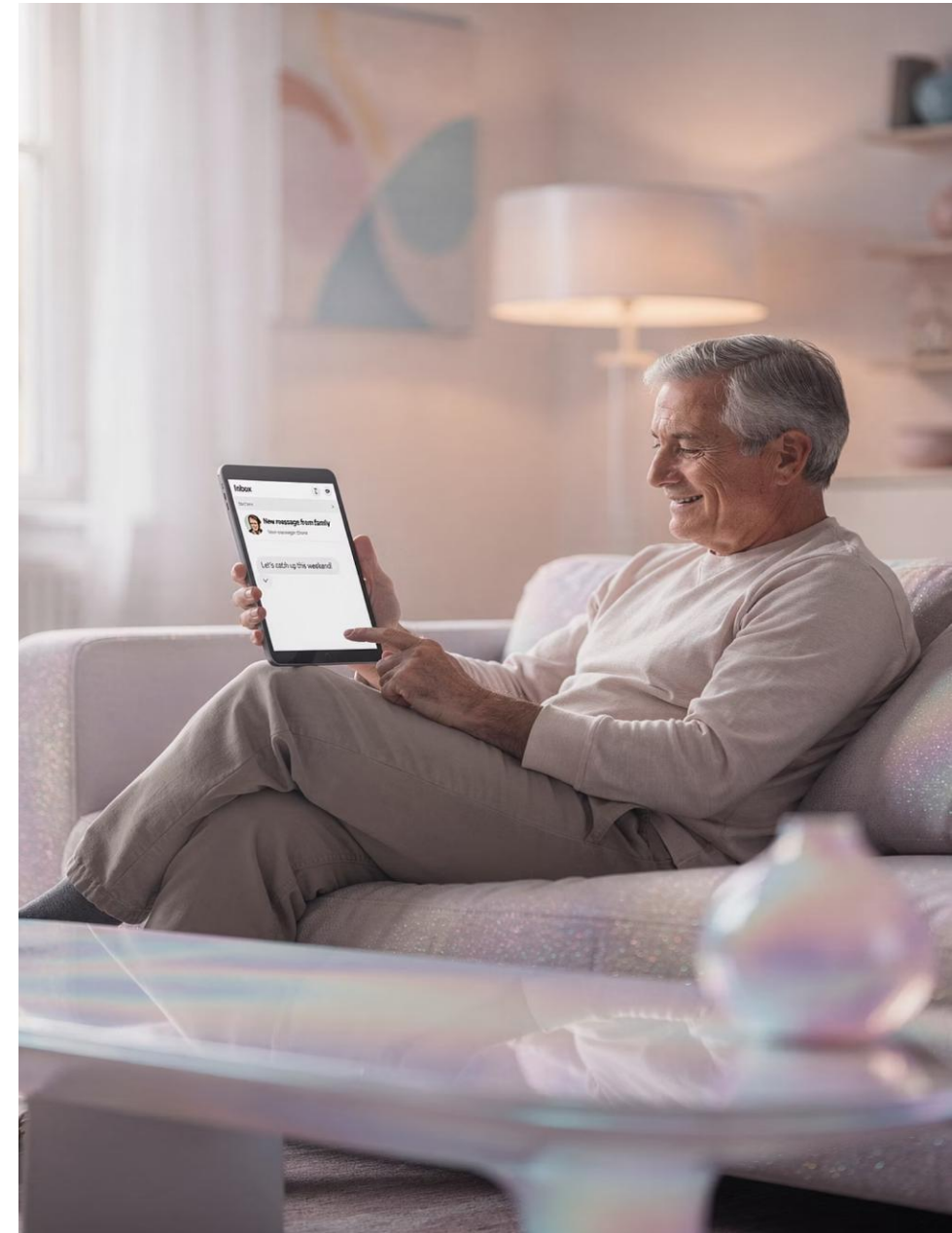
Reply

Respond when needed – no rush required.



Stay Connected

If you can open it, read it, and reply – you're already doing the important part.



Messages – Quick & Casual

Where Modern Communication Lives

Messages is quicker than email, more casual, and usually where family members send those three-word check-ins like *"You home yet?"*

It's one of the easiest ways to share a photo, send a short note, or stay in touch without making a whole production out of it.



Send Texts

Quick, casual messages to anyone.



Receive Replies

Responses come right back to the same conversation.



Share Photos

Send pictures directly from your iPad.

Calendar – Your Quiet Helper

A good calendar is like a dependable friend: not flashy, but awfully useful.

View Dates

See your week or month at a glance – appointments, birthdays, family visits.

Add Events

Haircuts, doctor visits, family gatherings – log them so you don't forget.

Reminders

Let the iPad keep track of what your brain shouldn't have to juggle alone.



Notes – The Unsung Hero

Write Anything

Grocery lists, phone numbers, password hints, questions for the doctor, gift ideas – it all fits here.

Best of all, it **saves automatically** – because forgetting to save is one of technology's oldest practical jokes.

Why Notes Deserves More Credit

→ Write Anything

No format required, just type and go.

→ Auto-Save

Nothing gets lost – ever.

→ Easy to Find

All your notes in one organized place.





Camera Basics

The iPad camera is wonderfully simple at its core. Open the Camera app, aim it where you want, and tap the shutter button. That's the basic recipe.

📄 You're not going to break anything by taking a picture. Worst case, you get a blurry shot of your thumb – which puts you in very good company.

01

Open Camera App

Find it on your Home screen and tap.

02

Aim

Point the iPad at what you want to capture.

03

Tap the Shutter

The big round button takes the photo.

Taking a Photo

Frame It. Tap. Done.

If what you want is on the screen, you're basically ready. Line it up, hold the iPad as steady as you can, and tap the button.

It doesn't have to be National Geographic. The goal is simply to capture the moment — the person, the receipt, the plant, or whatever you want to remember.



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Front vs. Back Camera

Back Camera

Better quality. Use this for taking pictures of things in front of you — scenery, people, documents, food.

Front Camera

For selfies & video calls. Points toward your face. If your own forehead suddenly fills the screen, don't panic — you just flipped the camera.

 Switching between cameras is easy — look for the flip icon inside the Camera app. You didn't break the iPad. You just changed the view.

Where Photos Go

When you take a picture, it gets saved automatically into the **Photos app**. Think of it this way:

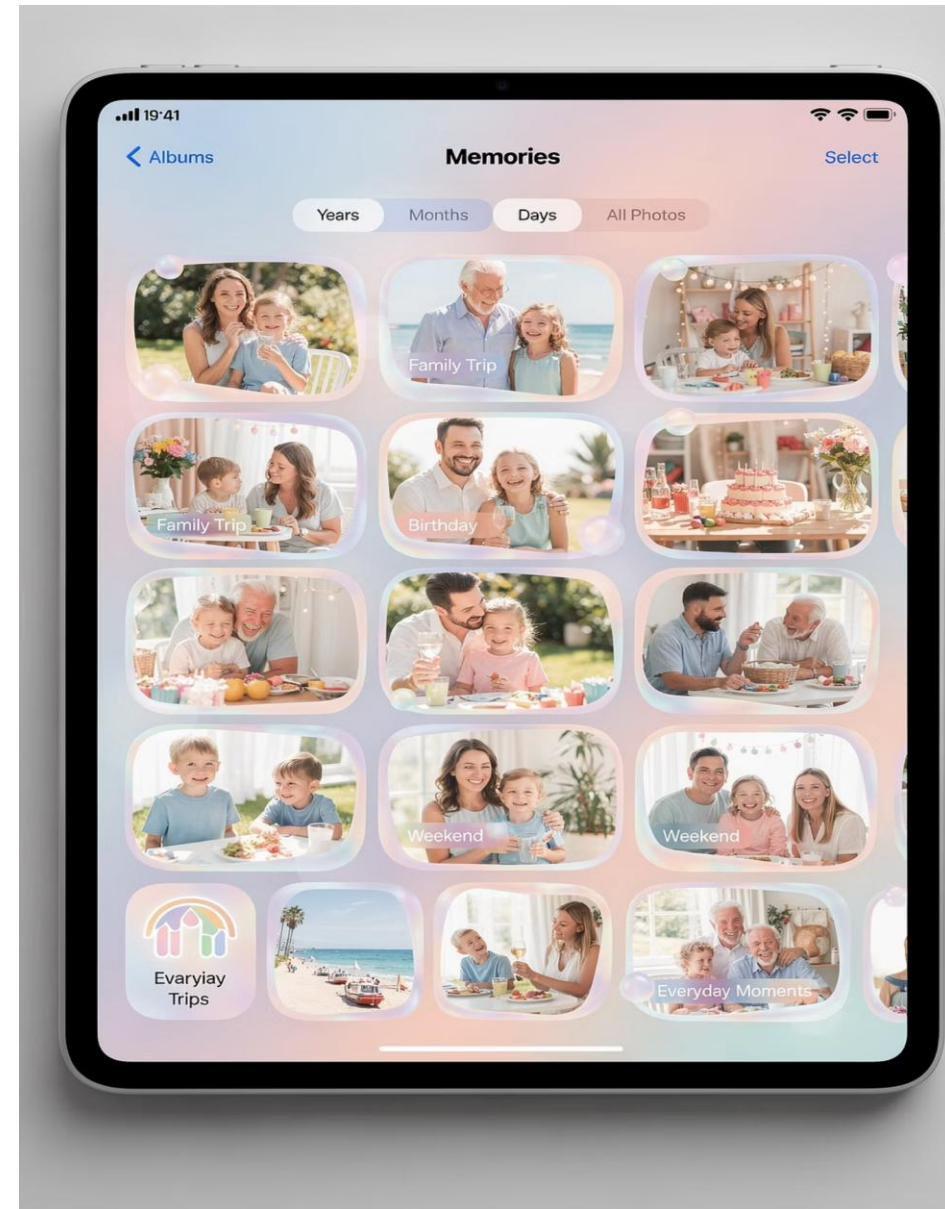
Camera App

The act of snapping the shot – your shutter, your moment.



Photos App

The album where everything lives afterward – stored automatically, one place.



Viewing Your Photos

Three Simple Moves

- 1 Tap**
Open any photo to view it full screen.
- 2 Swipe**
Swipe left or right to move through pictures.
- 3 Zoom**
Pinch or spread two fingers to zoom in or out.



Tap, swipe, zoom. Three little moves that make you look like you know exactly what you're doing – and by then, you usually do.



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Slide 21 – Photo Reassurance

Safe to look

Nothing breaks

Nothing lost

Let's clear something up right here, because this one trips up a lot of people.

You cannot damage a photo by looking at it. You can't wear it out, you can't erase it by accident just by opening it.

So that little hesitation – that **"what if I mess something up?"** feeling – we're officially retiring that today.

Slide 22 – When Something Feels Lost

Key Points

- Usually not gone
- Just moved
- Stay calm

When something feels lost on the iPad, it's almost never actually gone.

It's usually just moved, tucked away, or sitting somewhere you didn't expect.

So the first move isn't panic – it's pause. **Calm beats guessing every single time.**



Slide 23 – Spotlight Search



Swipe down



Type



Find instantly

This right here is your secret weapon: search. Swipe down from the middle of the screen, type what you're looking for – an app, a name, a photo – and let the iPad do the heavy lifting.



If you remember one thing from this section, make it this: when in doubt, search it out.



Slide 24 – Finding Apps

Remember

- Apps move
- Use search
- Don't panic

Apps don't disappear – they just wander a bit. Maybe they got moved to another screen, maybe tucked into a folder.

Instead of hunting screen by screen, just search for the app name and open it instantly.

Saves time, saves frustration, and **saves your sanity.**



Slide 25 – Finding Photos

Photos app

Almost always right where they belong – inside the Photos app.

Scroll

You can scroll through them at your own pace.

Search

Use search if you remember something about the picture – like a place or a person.

Once you get used to how photos are organized, it starts to feel a lot less like a maze.

 MODULE 4 – Sharing

Slide 26 – Share Icon

The Share Button

- Square with arrow
- Sends a copy
- Original stays

That little square with the arrow pointing up – that's your share button.

And here's the important part: when you share something, you're sending a **copy** – not the original.

Nothing disappears, nothing gets "used up." You're just making a duplicate to send along.



Slide 27 – Texting Photos



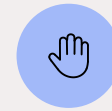
Quick

Tap and send in seconds.



Easy

No fuss, no ceremony.



Convenient

Great for one or two pictures to family or friends.

Texting photos is the fast and easy option. Tap, send, done – no fuss, no ceremony.

It's the digital version of "**Hey, take a look at this.**"



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Slide 28 – Emailing Photos

Why Email?

- Better quality
- Good for printing
- Reliable

If the photo matters a little more – maybe you want to print it or keep better quality – email is the better route.

It keeps more detail and tends to be more reliable for important things.

Think of texting as **quick sharing**, and email as slightly more "**formal delivery.**"



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Slide 29 – Multiple Photos

01

Select several

You're not limited to one photo at a time.

Once you've done it once, it becomes second nature.

02

Send together

Select several and send them all together.

03

Follow prompts

The iPad will guide you through it step by step.



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Slide 30 – Sharing Reminder

Pause first

Before you send something, take a quick pause and make sure it's going where you want it to go.

Hard to undo

Once it's sent, it's a lot harder to pull back.

Think before sending

A two-second pause can save a ten-minute headache.

 **Here's a little old-school wisdom that still applies: measure twice, cut once.**

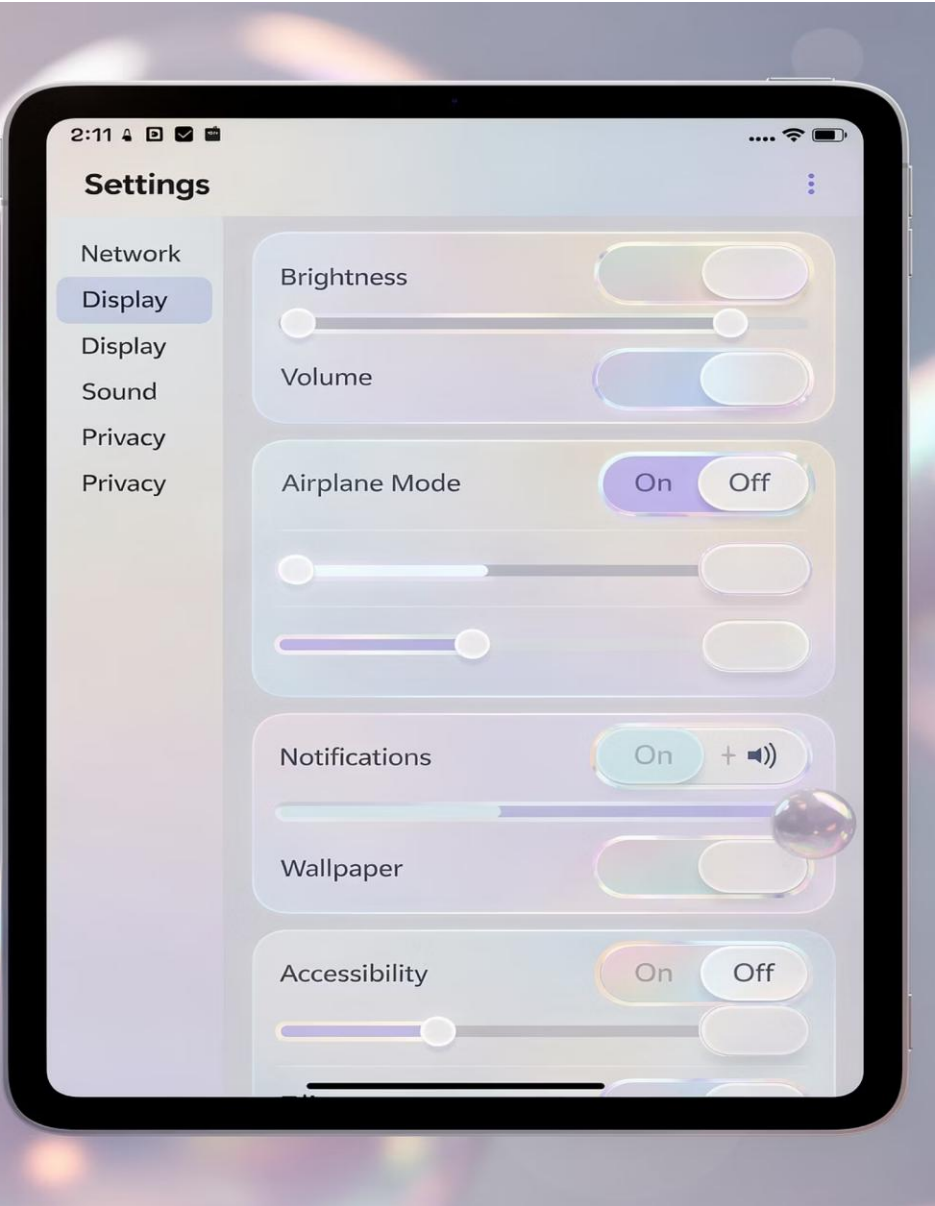
 MODULE 5 – Settings



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Slide 31 – Settings Overview

Key Points

- Customize
- Safe to explore
- Nothing permanent

Settings is where you adjust how the iPad behaves – brightness, sound, connections, and more.

And the key thing to remember is this: **it's safe to explore.** You're not going to break anything by looking around.

Worst case, you change something and then change it right back.



Slide 32 – Brightness & Volume



Adjust screen

Too bright or too dim – you can adjust all of it to suit your eyes.



Control sound

Too loud or too quiet – find the level that works for you.



Improve comfort

Technology should adapt to you – not the other way around.

The goal is simple: **make the iPad feel comfortable for you.**



Slide 33 – Wi-Fi Check

1 Must be connected


If something isn't working – email won't load, Safari won't open pages – the first thing to check is Wi-Fi.

2 Enables apps

No connection usually means no internet, and no internet means a lot of things won't work.

3 First fix step

Before anything else, check Wi-Fi. It solves more problems than you'd think.

 MODULE 6 – Confidence



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Slide 34 – Mistakes Are Normal

Mistakes are...

- Expected
- Reversible
- Helpful

Mistakes are not only normal — **they're part of the process.**

You tap the wrong thing, open the wrong app, close something by accident — it happens to everyone.

And the good news is, almost everything is reversible. **That's how you learn.**



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Slide 35 – Getting Unstuck



Pause

Don't keep digging the hole deeper.



Go home

Press the Home button or swipe back to your main screen.



Try again

Start fresh. That simple reset solves a surprising number of problems.



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Slide 36 – Practice Mindset

1

Repeat

Do it once, then again, then again.

2

Go slow

Take your time and let it sink in.

3

Build confidence

That's how this goes from "new" to "normal."

 **Confidence doesn't come from one perfect try – it comes from repetition.**

Use apps

Open and navigate apps with confidence.



Take photos

Capture and find your photos easily.

Send photos and messages with confidence.

Slide 38 – Accessibility

Built-in Tools

- Larger text
- Zoom
- Comfort first

The iPad also has built-in tools to make things easier to see and use – larger text, zoom features, and more.

There's no prize for squinting. If something can be made clearer or easier, go ahead and use those features.

Comfort always comes first.

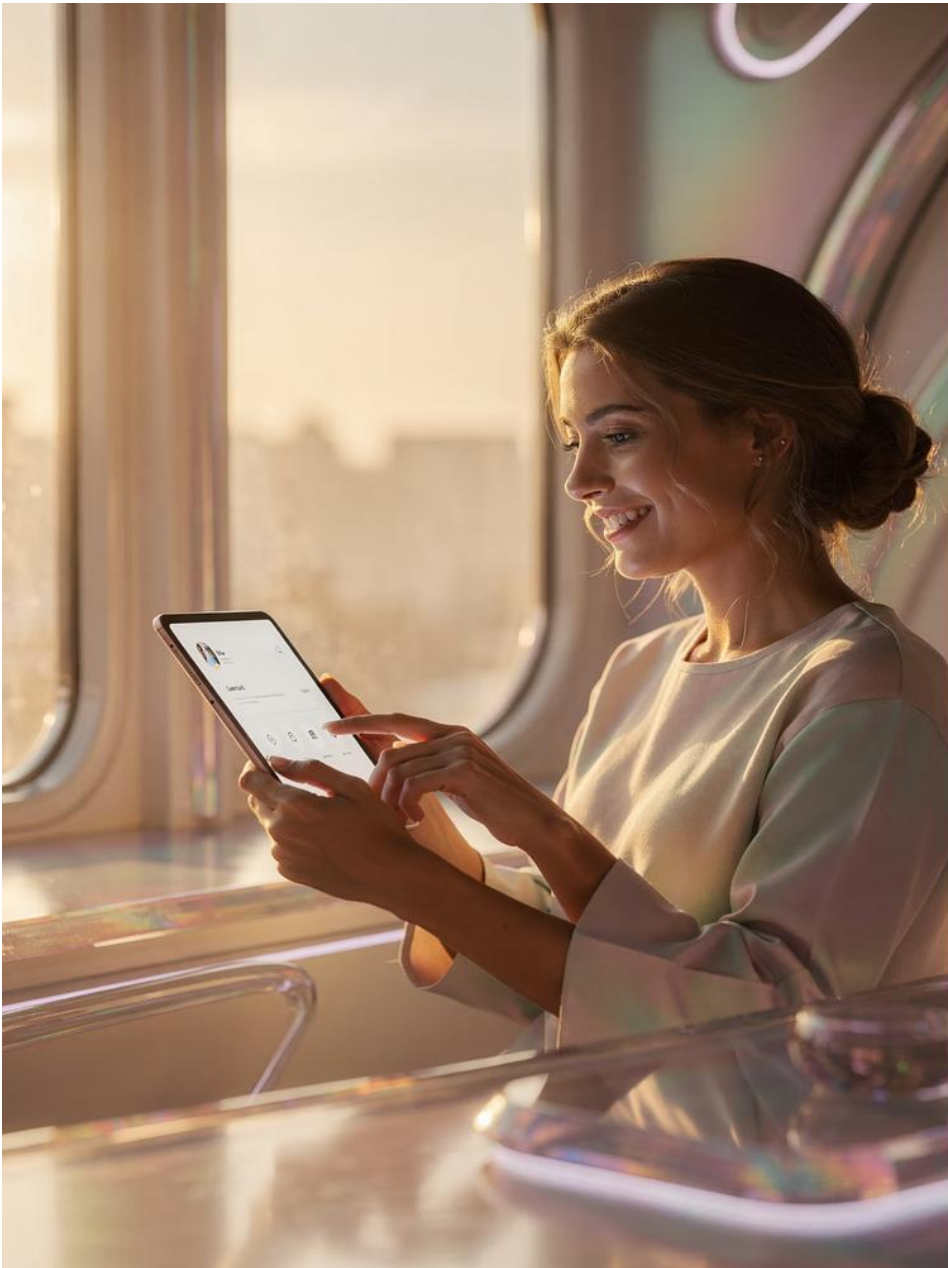
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Slide 40 – Final Reassurance

You didn't break anything

You learned something
